The Journal of Medical Investigation (J Med Invest) is published by The University of Tokushima Faculty of Medicine for the issue of original articles, case reports and reviews in the medicine. Four numbers that make a volume are published a year. Authors submitting a paper do so on the understanding that the work has not been published before, is not being considered for publication elsewhere and has been read and approved by all authors.

Manuscripts should be carefully revised before submission. There will be charge of approx. ¥12,000 per printed page. As a general rule, papers will be evaluated by two independent reviewers. Revised manuscripts should be accompanied by a point-by-point reply to the recommendations of reviewers and editor, specifying the changes made in the revised version. When the manuscript is accepted for publication, the authors must agree to automatic transfer to the copyright to The Journal of Medical Investigation.

Manuscripts Submit manuscripts in triplicate (one original and two copies) and provide your manuscript on one newly formatted 3.5-inch floppy disk, MO, CD or USB Memory filed in text style ; complete style printed manuscripts on white A 4 paper with 3 cm margin in each sides, double-spaced copies including figures and tables must accompany the disk. Mark a special character such as italic, bold, subscript, superscript, Greek letters, mathematical symbols et al.. The printed manuscript and the file on the disk must be the same. Label the disk clearly with authors' names and file content.

The paper should be submitted in English. Manuscripts should be organized and numbered consecutively as follows : title page, abstract, introduction, patients and methods / materials and methods, results, discussion, acknowledgements, reference list, tables, legends to figures and figures in that order. Drawings and charts for reproduction should be made in black and laser quality. Photographs (maximum 17 cm in width x 22 cm in length) and drawings should be numbered on the back. Color illustrations are acceptable, however, the author(s) are requested to pay the extra costs. Author (s) should indicate the appropriate position of the text figures and tables on the manuscripts.

Abbreviations should conform to the style accepted in the Japanese Medical Sciences and used in the Quarterly Cumulative Index Medicus.

Manuscripts should be checked by native speaker.

All human investigation must be conducted according to the principles expressed in the Declaration of Helsinki.

All studies involving animals must state that guidelines for the use and care of laboratory animals of the authors' institution or any national law were followed.

Title page The title page should contain : 1. a concise informative title ; 2. author(s)'s names ; 3. name of department(s) / institution(s) to which the work is attributed ; 4. name, address, telephone and fax numbers of the author to whom correspondence about the manuscript, and requests for offprints should be referred ; 5. a running head of no more than 40 characters.

Abstract and key words The abstract must not exceed 200 words. It should state the purpose of the study, basic procedures (study subject / patients / animals and methods), main findings, and principal conclusions. Below the abstract, provide 3-5 key words that will assist indexers in cross-indexing your article. Use terms from the Medical Subject Headings list from Index Medicus, whenever possible.

Acknowledgements Acknowledge persons and grant sources that have made substantive contributions to the study

References Number references consecutively in the order in which they are first mentioned in the text. Identify references in text, tables and legends by arabic numerals(in parentheses). All references cited, and only these, must be listed at the end of the paper. All authors' names should be described. Abbreviations of journals must conform to those used in Index Medicus of the National Library of Medicine. The format should conform to the examples listed below :
